The NATO-led operation to prevent Muammar Qaddafi's forces from inflicting mass atrocities on Libyan civilians was the first United Nations-authorized military intervention which explicitly invoked the "responsibility to protect" principle as grounds for action. The Global Centre for the Responsibility to Protect and Human Rights Foundation will host a discussion on what the Libyan intervention means for future international efforts to protect civilians, particularly in light of the ongoing challenges in Syria and beyond. Panelists Genser and Cotler are co-editors of the new book *The Responsibility to Protect: The Promise of Stopping Mass Atrocities in Our Times* (Oxford University Press 2011).
